The Canton Clay Works offers exciting and engaging visiting artist and residency programs for school districts throughout the state. Our lectures, slide shows, demonstrations, and hands-on activities are designed for the needs of each class or department. Interdepartmental disciplines (earth science, cultural enrichment, chemistry, vocational development, and art history) are incorporated into our programs. Extensive instruction in throwing on the potter's wheel, hand building, sculptural techniques, and slip application/decoration are offered.
